We are excited to invite you to take advantage of our *Community Solar for Community Action* program!

How a Community Solar Array Works

Community solar works differently from having panels installed on your home. As the sun shines on the panels at our Westminster office, they produce electricity and create Renewable Energy Credits. **These credits turn into dollars that are paid toward your Green Mountain Power electric bill.** SEVCA will make those credits available to approximately 50 households in our service area to reduce their energy burden.

What It Means for SEVCA Clients

Clients who are selected for the program can expect to receive a monthly credit on their electricity bill. **Depending on the time of year, this could range between \$10 to \$50 each month.** This money saved on electricity can potentially be used towards other household needs.

How to Apply

Please take the time to fill out the application and either return it to us by mail or bring it to one of our offices. **Applicants will need to provide information about their household, electricity account, and income.** The deadline to apply is **August 29th**. We will review the applications and contact the selected households. Those not selected will be placed on a waiting list.

We will require that you apply for assistance through SEVCA's Weatherization program or Efficiency Vermont in the first year. These programs can help reduce your long-term energy expenses and make it easier to make ends meet. SEVCA staff are here to support you in this process.
